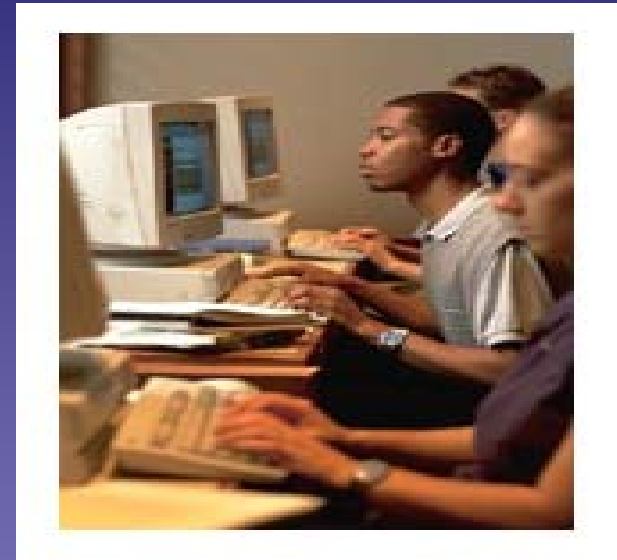
Becoming an Alumni Recruitment Volunteer

Basic DePaul Facts

- Founded in 1898, continues to be the largest Catholic university, and the 9th largest private university in the U.S.
- 2 Main Campuses in Lincoln Park and the Loop, as well as 6 suburban locations.
- Technologically sophisticated with high speed/wireless internet access and over 900 computers on campus available to students.
- Over 100 majors in 9 colleges (College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, College of Communication, School of Education, The Theatre School, The School of Music, College of Commerce, The College of Computing and Digital Media, The College of Law, and The School of New Learning).

- 15,024 Undergraduate Students, 2,522 freshman students.
- Gender: 56% female, 44% male.
- Lincoln Park and Loop Campus named “Best College Town” by Princeton Review in 2008.
- Named one of the “Top 10 Most Diverse Campuses in the Nation” by the Princeton Review for 2008.



DePaul Student Life

- DePaul now has more than 220 student organizations available, including fraternities and sororities.
- DePaul offers a wide variety of housing, each with its own unique characteristics and community, all exhibiting cultural and social attractions.
- Offers University Ministry and Community Service opportunities.
- 13 NCAA Division I Intercollegiate sports (7 for women and 6 for men) . DePaul competes in the Big East Conference against other universities like Notre Dame, Marquette, and Louisville.
- Theatre School and Music School put on over 250 performances and 45 productions at both campuses each academic year.
- Offers world class, up to date facilities (Ray Meyer Fitness Center, Student Center, NCAA Athletic Center, McGowan Science Building).



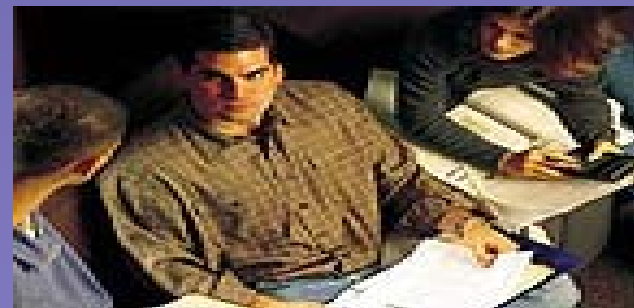
DePaul Admission

- **Students who apply by the Early Action Program Deadline of November 15 will receive full consideration for all merit scholarships and receive their decision by early January.**
 - ***This is not a binding decision, but simply means that the student will find out their admission decision by the first week of January and will receive full consideration for all merit scholarships.**
- **The priority deadline for Regular admission is February 1. Applicants are considered on a space available basis after this date.**
- **Applications to the School of Music and The Theatre School must be submitted by January 15th. Notification of Music and Theatre admission decisions will be made in late March.**
- **Students today apply to 15-20 unique colleges. DePaul University receives nearly 12,000 applications, of which over 8,000 of those are admitted. Out of those admitted, between 2,400-2,500 enroll.**

Freshman Profile

- High School GPA: 3.4/4.0 scale
- ACT Composite: 22-27 (middle 50%)
- SAT: CR 520-630; M 510-620 (middle 50%)
 - Writing Section is not considered for admission purposes
- Class Rank: 48% in top quarter of class
- All applications are individually reviewed.

**DePaul still considers a variety of factors and admissions considerations does not rely solely on scores indicated above. Refer to your booklet for more details on admissions.

Fee Waiver Program

- The Office of Undergraduate Admission offers alumni the opportunity to request the undergraduate application fee be waived for one prospective student per academic year.

Regional Receptions/Counselor Breakfasts

- The Office of Admission is hosting regional receptions and counselor breakfasts in 20 locations across the country in the fall and spring in locations as far as San Francisco and as close as Springfield, IL
- Alumni are invited to attend and to share their experiences at DePaul to perspective student and high school guidance counselors.

Adopt-A-School Program

- Alumni would be a great asset in reaching out to newly admitted students from a high school in your area or even your alma mater.
- Outreach may include attending a program at the high school or calling to congratulate them on being admitted to DePaul.
- This will provide students with another perspective on what DePaul offers and help the admission office yield additional students.

Local/Area College Fairs

- A great way for alumni volunteers to assist in recruitment practices is to attend college fairs in the area either as the solo representative for DePaul or in conjunction with a DePaul Admission Counselor.
- DePaul University attends over 250 college fairs each recruiting season, with a majority being in Illinois. Some fairs require 2-3 people in attendance, and alumni volunteers would be a great addition to have on hand.

 - Admitted Student Days (Spring 2010)
 - College In Sight (March 2010)
